**Subject:** ROBBED IN BROAD DAYLIGHT

The Miami Police Department is investigating a robbery that occurred on November 24, 2019, at approximately 8:40 a.m. in the area of 1701 N.W. 54 Street.

According to investigators, the victims, a 45- and 55-year-old male were standing outside of the incident location when they were approached by two subjects who brandished firearms while their property was demanded from them. Both subjects then fled on foot immediately after the incident.

Shortly thereafter, one of the victims entered his vehicle and followed both subjects until N.W. 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue and N.W. 55<sup>th</sup> Terrace at which point an exchange of gunfire ensued. The victim managed to hold one of the subjects down until police arrived. The second subject subsequently fled westbound on N.W. 18<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 55<sup>th</sup> Street on foot.

Miami Police are searching for the second subject who remains at large; described as a black male, 5'8 - 5'10, 30 - 35 years of age, approximately 160 – 170 lbs, unshaven. He was last seen wearing an orange hoodie and shorts.

Miami Police Robbery Detectives have arrested William Eaton, D.O.B. 2/10/1990 for his involvement in the incident. See attached arrest affidavit.
