Subject: **WOMAN ROBBED OF TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS**

The City of Miami Police Department's Robbery Detectives are investigating a strong-arm robbery that occurred at 3245 Virginia Street on Friday, March 13, 2020, at approximately 1:30 p.m.

According to detectives, the victim entered the Bank of America located at 3211 Grand Avenue to make a withdraw. The victim withdrew \$10,000.00 from her account, exited the bank, entered her vehicle and drove home. As the victim arrived home; and parked her vehicle in her assigned parking spot, she began to unload items from the trunk of her vehicle. The victim began to walk toward her home, at which point in time she was confronted from behind by a suspect who is seen on surveillance video exiting the rear of a white pick-up truck. The suspect snatched her purse and fled on foot exiting the apartment complex's parking lot. As the victim attempted to chase after the suspect; she observed him enter into a second offending vehicle; which happened to be a black newer model pick-up truck.

The suspect ran off with the victim's cellphone, \$10,000.00 in U.S. Currency, Florida identification card, Bank of America debit card, along with additional miscellaneous items thrown inside of her purse.

Detectives need your assistance after exhausting leads regarding this investigation.

Note: The circumstances surrounding this incident suggests that the victim was being followed.

Suspect 1: Black male, possibly in his 20's, short black fade. Last seen wearing what appeared to be a mechanic shirt with long blue pants.

Suspect 2: Driver of white pick-up truck. Black male, short hair cut. Last seen wearing a black long sleeve shirt and dark colored pants.

Suspect 3: Driver of black pick-up truck. Description unavailable.
