Subject: MIAMI POLICE APPREHEND SUSPECT INVOLVED IN STRING OF JEWELRY THEFTS TARGETING ONLINE SELLERS

The Miami Police Department's Robbery and Tactical Robbery Unit has apprehended <u>David</u> <u>Fontanez-Gutierrez</u>, <u>D.O.B. 5/16/1991</u> who is being accused of victimizing multiple individuals by arranging meet-ups under the guise of purchasing jewelry through a popular mobile application, only to flee with the items without payment.

The suspect's modus operandi involved using a disposable phone number to contact sellers who advertised jewelry for sale on the app and would then arrange in-person meetings to inspect and potentially purchase the items. Once face-to-face with the victims, the suspect would seize the jewelry and flee the scene, leaving the sellers threatened and empty-handed.

Authorities are urging anyone who may have been targeted by the suspect to come forward and assist in the ongoing investigation. Sellers who have fallen prey to similar schemes are encouraged to exercise caution and prioritize safety when engaging in transactions with unfamiliar buyers.

It is highly recommended to utilize the Miami Police Department's safe exchange zone located in front of the headquarters station located at <u>400 N.W. 2 Avenue</u> when conducting transactions with unknown individuals for buying or selling items.

Miami Police Chief Manny Morales commends the collaborative effort of the victims involved in providing valuable information that led to the suspect's apprehension. The diligent work of detectives and officers involved in this case highlights the commitment to ensuring the safety and security of all residents.
