## STUDENT HONORED BY THE DO THE RIGHT THING PROGRAM AND MIAMI POLICE FOR REPORTING CLASSMATE WHO BROUGHT A BULLET TO SCHOOL

MIAMI, FL – March 19, 2024 – As school safety takes the national spotlight, the Do The Right Thing Program will honor 10 outstanding students out of over 900 nominees, who serve as an inspiration to the community and are being honored for doing the right thing by Miami Police. One of these students, Cameron McLane, a student at Johnnie M. Parris/Colonial Drive Elementary, is being honored for his bravery in reporting a classmate that had brought a bullet to school. **The ceremony takes place on Wednesday, March 20, 2024 at 10:00 am in the auditorium of the Chief Clarence Dickson Police College, 350 NW 2<sup>nd</sup> Avenue.**

Do The Right Thing, Inc. is a non-profit community-based program operating in cooperation with the Miami Police Department and other local law enforcement. The program serves school age youth throughout Miami-Dade County by recognizing positive accomplishments and behavior. Each month of the school year students are recognized for their positive decisions and rewarded with prizes including a tablet, plaque, a Do The Right Thing t-shirt and bumper sticker, two tickets to a Miami Marlins game, a free pizza from Papa John's, gift cards, passes to Zoo Miami and Island Queen Cruises, and letters from United States Senators Rick Scott and Marco Rubio as well as Congresswoman Maria Elvira Salazar. Two Special Recognition students are also selected and win trips to Rapids Water Park and Washington, D.C. Since its inception, Do The Right Thing has directly impacted over 270,000 youth across Miami-Dade County. Building positive relationships between police and youth at an early age can make all the difference!
